A Guide to Prepare Your Manuscript to the Proceedings of Numerical Simulations in Astronomy 2002

Abstract

This guide shows how to prepare your manuscript to the proceedings of Numerical Simulations in Astronomy 2002. Those of you who presented oral talk in the meeting are given 10 pages in the proceedings. Tables and figures can be included in the article. Proceedings will be sent to the ADS (NASA's Astrophysics Data System) and become available through electronic access.

Each abstract should be written within 200 words. Since this part will be submitted to the ADS directly, plain text form is preferred. This guide is an example of an article in the proceedings at the same time. Please follow the style of this guide.

1 General Remarks

Please follow instructions described in this guide. Your cooperation will help us significantly. Our proceedings format follows IATEX (IATEX2.09). Please use standard commands and environments of IATEX only except those provided here. If you have any questions or comments about the proceedings, please contact nsa2002@cc.nao.ac.jp via e-mail.

2 Copyright

Since the proceedings is published in Japan, your articles are subject to the Copyright Act of Japan. Articles submitted to us should be original. The copyright of the proceedings itself is held by the Local Organizing Committee of Numerical Simulations in Astronomy 2002, while the copyright of each article is held by each author.

In order to publish the proceedings, we need following two permissions from authors:

- 1. a permission to publish your article in the proceedings of Numerical Simulations in Astronomy 2002,
- 2. a permission to submit your article to the ADS and make it available through electronic access.

We need written permission from at least one of the authors for each article. We ask the first author (or a responsible author) to fill the COPYRIGHT AGREEMENT.

3 Submission

Send your LATEX source and EPS figure file(s) to nsa2002@cc.nao.ac.jp via e-mail. The deadline is

August 31, 2002.

4 Proofreading

Before publishing the proceedings, we will ask you to proofread your articles. We will announce it when it becomes ready.

5 Area Size

Your article will be printed in A4 size papers. The height and width of document area in each paper are set to be 255 mm and 168 mm, respectively.

6 Title

Following the PASJ (Publications of the Astronomical Society of Japan) style, the first letter of each word except prepositions ('at', 'to', ...), conjunctions ('and', 'or', ...), and articles ('a', 'an', and 'the'), is supposed to be capital, and others are lower-case. Visit http://www.asj.or.jp/pasj/en/index-E.html for the instruction to authors of PASJ.




Figure 1: The figure environment is employed. The width of the figure is set to be 80 mm.

7 Author's Information

We need two types of format: one is for our proceedings and the other is for the ADS.

In our proceedings format (part 1), order of Given name and Surname is up to you. Please add affiliation marks at the end of each author name with arabic number's superscript (use \affilmark{} command). We ask you to use arabic numbers from "1" for the affiliation marks. Put affiliation of author using \affiltext{#1}{#2} command. The argument #1 should be the same as the affiliation mark of the corresponding author. Put the affiliation text as the argument #2.

In the ADS format (part 2), please fill out \ADSauthors and \ADSaffiliations arguments in the head of the template LATEX source file following instructions described there.

9 Tables

Use table environment when you put your table (e.g., Table 1).

10 Figures

When you include figures, use a LATEX style macro which enables you and us to include PS files into your document. Remember that not only you but also we have to be able to handle your figures in order to print out your article. So, please choose a common macro.

When you want to include your PS files into your article, use figure environment (e.g., Figure 1).

You can include color PS figures into your article, though the proceedings book will be printed in B/W style. Color figures could be seen in and ADS.

11 References

When you cite some references, please follow PASJ style. Our \reference command can help you to make lines except the first line indent. You can see examples of references in Ikeuchi & Norman (1991).

12 Miscellaneous

Extra commands listed in Table 1 are available in the math mode.
